If you have not received a letter and your child has asthma please contact the school office who will arrange for one to be sent out to you.


All Aboard!

Timely arrival is essential to children's learning and enjoyment at school (we all know how uncomfortable it can be to arrive late for a meeting, or a social occasion); and of course it's crucial, when taking the bus or the train, that we aim to arrive a few minutes before it departs – it won't wait while we try to make up time.

Well, the Learning Trains start rolling at 8.50 for Key Stage 2 passengers, 8.55 for Key Stage 1; if you're not there when those doors open, your passenger will be forced to start the day running to catch up!

More than two hundred and fifty pupils have arrived on time every day since the start of September, but punctuality is nevertheless weak, at Seely: since the start of the school year we've had an average of almost twenty late arrivals a day, with almost twice that on some days! If your child is a regular at the Late Gate, do consider changes to the morning routine/departure time which might help; or let us know, if there are circumstances which make punctual arrival especially difficult.
