"Seeing first-hand what they have been doing to reduce single-use plastics in the kitchen and how they create healthy meals from scratch, which the children loved, was great to see."

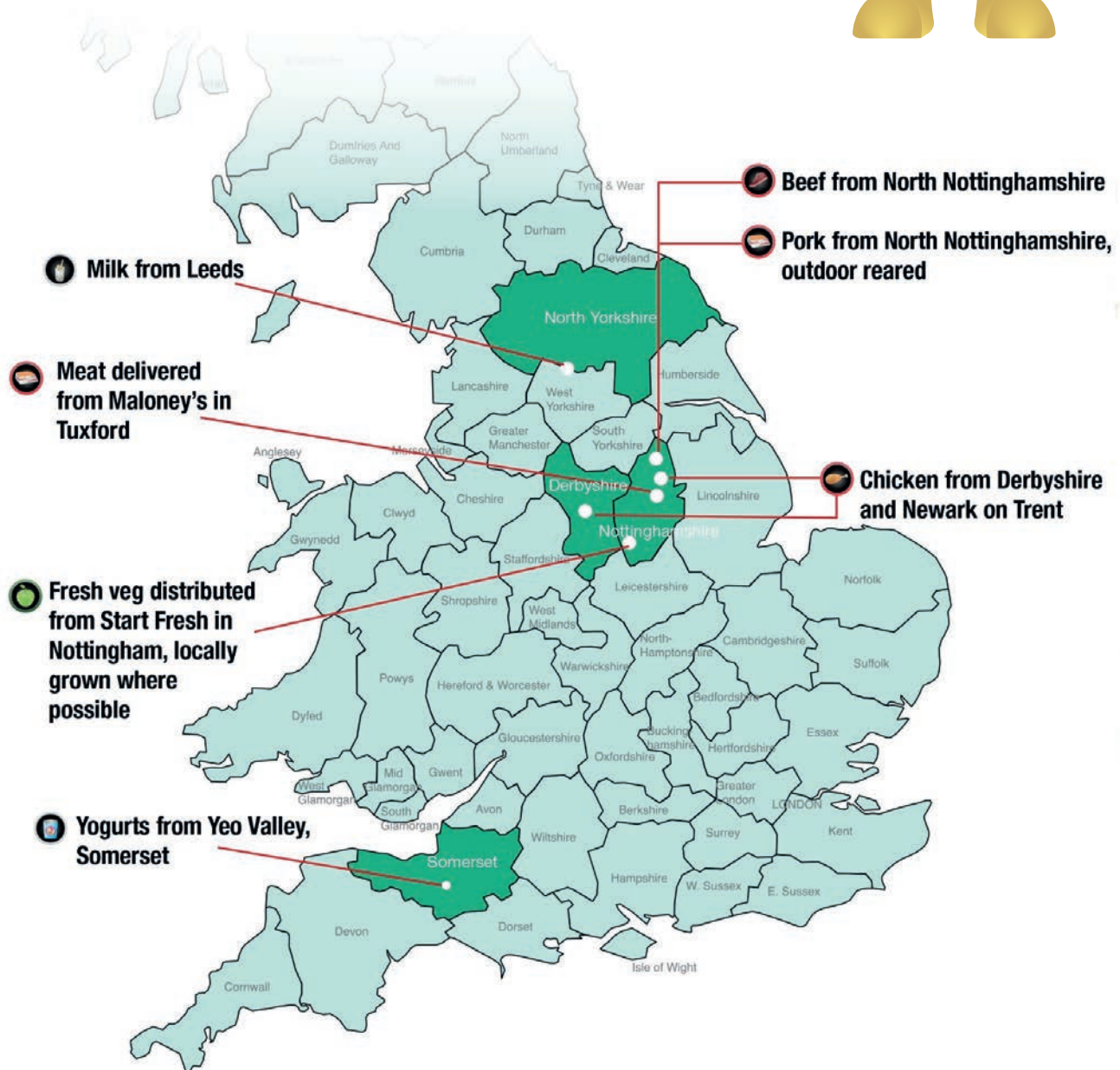


Where our food comes from...

Natasha's Law

From 1 October 2021, the requirements for prepacked for direct sale (PPDS) food labelling changed in line with Natasha's Law. The new labelling will help protect consumers by providing potentially life-saving allergen information on the packaging.

Our school trips lunch bags will now be labelled with allergen information according to Natasha's Law.

Free School Meals

Did you know that children can continue having free school meals in year 3 and beyond if you are in receipt of certain benefits?

A cooked school meal is a great way to give children all the energy they need to power through the school day. A nutritional school meal helps children concentrate in class as well as supporting their health and well-being.

All schools offer a vegetarian option every day and many of the city's schools provide a halal menu.

Our catering teams make sure there is something for everyone and children have unlimited salad, bread, fresh fruit and water at each sitting.

School meals are free for all children if they are in:

- reception class
- year 1
- year 2

And if you are in receipt of certain benefits your child can continue to have free school meals when they move into Key Stage 2.
