This half term seems to have gone so quickly. We have had Year 2 and Year 6 SATs, a trip to White Post Farm and a fabulous Eid Fayre.

Our children have been very calm during this assessment period and many visitors continue to comment on the calm and friendly atmosphere in school.

As activities resume, such as school trips and after school clubs, we really feel that we are getting back to normal after such a long time.

Year 2,4 and 6 children are very excited about their residential get-aways which start next week for Year 6.

Can we extend a huge thank you to all those involved in setting up the Eid fayre; it was wonderful to see the playground so busy after such a long time. It had been so well-organised and everyone had a fantastic time. One little boy who was only about three years old said "This is the best day of my whole life"!. How lovely.

We held our Special Person day last Friday and the children were so thoughtful in the gifts they chose. One little boy had chosen a pencil and rubber set for his big sister " as she needs these for school as she has run out".

You may have seen Mrs Clifford, the new headteacher, at the fayre. She also commented on the atmosphere in and around school and of the fayre itself. Mrs Clifford will be in school regularly over next half term so that we can liaise with her, so do say hello to her if you see her. She is very much looking forward to seeing you all.

We have had a number of reports from parents that many of our children are using WhatsApp to say hurtful comments to other children. This is sometimes bought into school, and if we are aware of it we can deal with it.

There are a number of groups that the children are involved in and we know that many would not dream of saying things to another child in person, but the "power of the collective" can sometimes lead them to do and d say things that they otherwise wouldn't'.

Please can you talk with your children about the use of social media, how to use it safely please. We always advise parents to check what their children are doing on-line and on social media.

We have been talking with the older children on how to stand up for their friends and pupils who they see being targeted in these forums. We have stressed that they can be seen as being complicit, just by being in the group and not even speaking out.

If you have any concerns about what is being said in these forums, please encourage your children to tell you, to leave the groups and come and report it to us if you believe it is being followed up in school.

Just a reminder that tomorrow is our INSET training day. Children will then return to school on Monday 6th June following the Jubilee weekend.

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Special Person Day: Last Friday saw the return of our Special Person Day which has not taken place since May 2019. It was a fantastic day seeing the children bring in their beautifully decorated bags and then making some very hard choices about what gift to choose for their 'Special Person'. It was great to hear some of the reasons they had for choosing their gift and who it was for - if any of you out there were lucky enough to be on the receiving end, we hope that you liked your gift. I would like to say a huge thank you to all of you who donated items and to all of the amazing parents who helped to sort and wrap the gifts.

We raised an incredible <u>£468</u>. From this £268 will go towards enrichment activities for our children and we have decided to donate £200 to a local family who are trying to raise money to get treatment for their daughter Winnie who is nearly 2 and has leukemia.
