




Instructions:

- 1. Start with an A4 piece of paper.
- 2. Fold it in half vertically.
- Unfold, then fold it in half horizontally.
- Unfold, then fold the edges up to the centre horizontally.
- 5. Flatten out your A4 sheet you should be left with 8 panels.
- Fold horizontally and cut a slit along the vertical line halfway down the centre.
- Unfold, then fold vertically and push the ends in towards the centre.
- Fold all the pages together, and you should be left with a mini book.
